program overview

The Forensic Mental Health in Community Health (FMHiCH) program sits within the Mental Health Pathways Cluster in the Services Network at cohealth.

cohealth FMHiCH is an initiative funded by the Victorian State Government and in partnership with Bendigo Community Health Service, provides high quality mental health services in the North-West Metropolitan Melbourne Bendigo regions.

The program is designed to improve mental health outcomes and reduce recidivism for adults who are completing a Mental Health and Treatment Rehabilitation condition through the Department of Justice and Community Safety.

The service is delivered by a multi-disciplinary team of mental health professionals who provide treatment and assessment support to eligible clients across nine Community Correctional Centres. The service operates with a trauma informed and culturally safe focus and in close collaboration and partnership with the Department of Health (DoH), Department of Justice and Community Safety (DOJCS), Area Mental Health Services, Forensic Clinical Specialists and General Practitioners.

position overview and purpose

The Mental Health Clinician provides clinical care and treatment for eligible people who are completing a Mental Health Treatment Rehabilitation condition as part of their Community Corrections Order or Parole Order. The Mental Health Clinician will be required to develop and maintain strong working relationships with key partners across the region including with Community Corrections and be skilled and capable in the delivery of community based, mental health and forensic services. As part of a high-functioning FMHiCH multi-disciplinary team, the Mental Health Clinician will ensure high quality and safe care for clients is always maintained.

FMHiCH is delivered from cohealth offices in Collingwood and Footscray and Mental Health Clinicians collocate at Corrections offices across the North West. Travel across the entire catchment will therefore be expected in this role.

An example of which may be Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) principals and approach • Provide appropriate follow-up care including review and referral to other agencies and GPs as required that support person centred care and recognise people's strengths within a community-based forensic framework • Undertake ongoing clinical risk assessments of participants and support risk management plans based on clinical and forensic information to provide a safe environment for the participants and others • Understanding of the forensic mental health system and how it influences care • Build strong partnerships with Corrections staff, Area Mental Health staff and other key providers to ensure appropriate information share to meet the needs of participants and the program
